ITEM 300 – PALLET RATE PRICING

All shipments picked up under Pallet Rate Pricing must conform to the following specifications. If any of these specifications are not met or adhered to, the Pallet Rate will be voided and regular Class Rates with a 60% discount will be applied to the shipment.

1. Applies to any commodity named in the NMFC 100 Series shipped on pallets.
2. Pallets may not exceed 48 x 48 inches in size and/or 84 inches (seven feet) in height.
 - a. Pallets exceeding the 84-inch (seven-foot) height limit will be billed an extra fee as set forth in Item 720 – Reweighs and Over-Sized Freight.
 - b. Pallets exceeding the length or width limits will be charged a pro-rata fee as set forth in Item 720 – Reweighs and Over-Sized Freight.
3. Each pallet may not weigh more than 2,000 pounds, including the skid. Pallets exceeding this weight will be subject to an overweight fee of \$0.20 per pound over the limit. (Example: a pallet weighing 2,200 pounds is 200 pounds over; $200 \times \$0.20 = \40.00 overweight fee.)
4. The shipper must load and the consignee must unload pallets.
5. Pallets must be picked up on a stretch-wrapped or banded skid and delivered on a stretch-wrapped or banded skid. Freight may not overhang the sides of the pallet in any manner.
6. If a pallet needs to be stripped for any reason at the time of delivery, the Pallet Rate will no longer apply, and Class Rates with a 60% discount will be applied to the shipment.
7. The driver may sign only for the number of pallets, not the number of pieces.
8. Notwithstanding Item 600, maximum liability will not exceed \$1.00 per pound per affected piece or package of any shipment, not to exceed the actual value of the merchandise.
9. Accessorial services, if required, are not included in the Pallet Rates named herein.
10. Rates apply only to shipments moving to points serviced on a direct basis by 2 Day.
11. For multi-stacked pallet rates to apply:
 - a. The bill of lading must state the number of pallets wrapped in the number of pallet spaces (e.g., "3 pallets wrapped in 2 pallet spaces"). The shipper must ensure the driver signs the bill of lading with this notation.
 - b. The pallets must be picked up stretch-wrapped or banded together and delivered stretch-wrapped or banded together.
 - c. Multi-stacked pallets, stretch-wrapped or banded together, may not exceed 48 inches long x 48 inches wide x 84 inches in height.

If these guidelines are not met or adhered to, charges will apply per pallet, not per pallet space.
